

## JASSO Scholarship Eligibility Conditions

Applicants must be students enrolled in a regular course of study in a higher educational institution outside Japan (hereinafter referred to as “home institution”), and satisfy all the following conditions listed in 1) to 7).

- 1) Students who do not currently possess Japanese citizenship.
- 2) Students accepted by a Japanese university under a student exchange agreement or other exchange arrangement with their home institution.
- 3) Students demonstrating excellent academic and personal records at their home institution, and having a minimum GPA of 2.30 (up to 3.00) as calculated using JASSO's GPA calculation method shown below. If a transcript from the previous academic year is not available, GPA will be calculated based on a transcript from the previous semester.

### [Grade Point Conversion]

Use the table below to convert grades into grade points, and the formula below to calculate GPA.

Round off to two decimal places. (i.e. 2.654 would be rounded to 2.65, while 2.655 would be rounded to 2.66.)

### Grade Formula

$$\frac{([\text{No. of GP3 Credits}] \times 3) + ([\text{No. of GP2 Credits}] \times 2) + ([\text{No. of GP1 Credits}] \times 1) + ([\text{No. of GP0 Credits}] \times 0)}{\text{Total Number of Registered Credits}}$$

\*No. = Number, \*GP = Grade Point

\*If applicants have taken courses that are not part of the credit system, replace the number of credits in the GPA formula with the number of courses taken.

- 4) Students not having the financial means to study in Japan.
- 5) Students eligible for a “Student Visa”. If the student will study in Japan for 90 days or less, the Japanese university will arrange the status of residence.
- 6) Students who will resume or complete their studies at their home institution upon termination of the period of study in Japan.

- Students who will withdraw or be removed from their home institution do not satisfy this condition.
- Students who will graduate or complete a regular course of study at their home institution during the period of study in Japan do not satisfy this condition.

7) In case of students who will receive an additional scholarship for studying in Japan (excl. travel expenses and student loans) together with the JASSO scholarship, the monthly stipend (or total amount of monthly stipends if receiving multiple scholarships) of the other scholarship(s) should not exceed JPY 80,000.

-If students receive another scholarship whose terms do not allow the receiving of additional scholarships once or more during the period of study in Japan, they are not eligible for this scholarship.

-Students cannot receive the “Monbukagakusho Honors Scholarship for Privately-Financed International Students” together with this scholarship.

-Students cannot receive “Japanese Government (Monbukagakusho: MEXT) Scholarships” together with this scholarship.
